PROFILE

I am an intervention scientist contributing to the fields of family therapy and suicidology. My research trajectory is centered on clinical interventions and prevention strategies to address suicidality and mental health distress among adolescents and young adults. As a family therapist, I am sensitive to the impact of psychosocial development, cultural context, and familial relationships on etiology and treatment of these concerns. To best address the needs of youth populations, I study empirically-supported approaches aimed to strengthen familial, interpersonal, and community relationships. My intervention work specifically focuses on the adaptation, implementation and dissemination (AD&I science) of such approaches for underserved and/or vulnerable youth. AD&I science intends to translate, spread, and increase the quality/fit of empirically-supported interventions to reduce the research-practice gap in the health professions. Conducting effective AD&I science requires active engagement with community constituent groups. Therefore, community-engaged research (CEnR) is a fundamental value of my approach to science, practice, and education. To build my CEnR network, I established a transdisciplinary research initiative: *The Alliance for the Study of Suicide Prevention and Intervention through Relationship Enrichment* (ASPIRE). The goal of ASPIRE is to develop and research strategies to address mental health distress among populations vulnerable to suicide. The approaches studied by ASPIRE aim to strengthen relationships, empower communities, and develop collaborative partnerships.
